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Overview

Cambodia, officially The Kingdom of Cambodia, is a Southeast Asian nation and a member of ASEAN. It covers a total land area of 181,035 km² and borders Thailand, Laos, Vietnam and the Gulf of Thailand.

As of mid-2025, Cambodia's estimated population is 17.85 million. Its population density stands at roughly 101 people per km², with 26.5% living in urban areas and a median age of 26.2 years.

Cambodia's economy is classified as lower-middle income, with nominal GDP at approximately US \$49.8 billion in 2024 and real growth projected at about 5.8% in 2025. In 2024, its GDP was made up of approximately 42% from services, 35% from industry — mainly driven by manufacturing — and 23% from agriculture.









Key Industry Sectors

The textiles and garments sector remains the backbone of industry, employing approximately 918,700 workers across roughly 1,680 factories. Garment exports were US \$11.7 billion in 2024 (46% of total exports), with footwear adding another US \$3.5 billion.

Manufacturing expanded rapidly with 326 new factories in 2024, bringing total large-scale facilities to about 2425. Emerging sectors include electronics (projected at 10.3% annual growth through 2029) and automotive assembly. BYD's Sihanoukville plant aims to produce 10,000 EVs annually.

Food processing is also on the rise with expected Compound Annual Growth Rate (CAGR) of 14.5%, covering processed fruits, meats, grains and seafood.

Tourism has rebounded strongly. Cambodia welcomed 6.7 million international tourists in 2024, contributing around 12% of its GDP. The target for 2025 has been set at 7.5 million visitors, aided by new infrastructure like the Techo International Airport opening in Phnom Penh in the last quarter of 2025.

Entertainment & Lifestyle

Phnom Penh and Siem Reap are the epicentres of urban life, offering night markets, rooftop bars, cafes and art galleries alongside French-colonial architecture.

On the internet, speeds have improved significantly, with the median mobile speed at 29.37 Mbps. Young Cambodians are driving trends in K-pop-inspired music, local streaming content, and café culture blended with artisanal local offerings.







Cambodia continues to improve *healthcare* access, though rural areas still face challenges in quality and coverage. Health indicators show progress, but demands for expanded facilities and trained personnel remain.

Public institutions like the University of Health Sciences in Phnom Penh trains over 6,100 students in medicine, pharmacy, nursing, dentistry, and public health, with postgraduate and doctoral programmes available.

The *education* system is expanding, yet literacy and enrolment rates vary. Schooling is free and compulsory from ages 6 to 14, covering primary and lower secondary levels. Preschool, though not compulsory, is available for children aged 3 to 5, with growing government and NGO support to expand access.

Cambodia is a nation at the crossroads. It is richly steeped in Khmer heritage, yet rapidly industrialising, and embracing tourism and digital-era vitality. As a small open economy, she has not been insulated against globale developments. To continue the journey towards ending extreme poverty and enhancing living standards, she needs a more sustainable pattern of growth, supported by higher productivity, bold structural reforms, quality investments in infrastructure and human capital and climate-smart development policies.







Singapore Business Investment Forum (SBIF)'s Donation Drive Initiative

The Singapore Business Investment Forum (SBIF) concluded a successful donation drive at the National Center for Infants and Children in September 2024.

Corporate Social Responsibility activities, such as this donation drive, reaffirm SBIF's commitment to being a socially responsible

organisation that supports local communities in Cambodia. In addition, they complement the organisation's core objectives of connecting Singaporean businesses through networking, knowledge and resource sharing, advocating for business interests and attracting Singaporean investments to Cambodia.



Celebrating Cambodia-Singapore 60 years of Bilateral Relations





Singapore and Cambodia Relations: A Partnership of Development, Resilience and Common Vision

Building bilateral ties between nations is crucial in promoting collaboration across sectors such as tourism, trade and education. Over the years, Singapore and Cambodia have worked in close cooperation, and this has fostered mutual understanding and economic growth.

HISTORICAL FOUNDATIONS

Singapore separated from Malaysia and declared its independence on 9 August 1965. Cambodia was among the first nations to recognise Singapore's sovereignty and diplomatic ties were soon established.

A PERIOD OF UPHEAVAL

When the Khmer Rouge came into power in 1975, diplomatic ties were cut off as Singapore did not formally recognise the regime. Yet, Singapore continued to maintain trade relations with Cambodia. After Vietnam's invasion of Cambodia and the fall of the Khmer Rouge in 1979, Cambodia embarked on recovery and re-engagement. Throughout this period, Singapore

provided humanitarian aid, and trade links continued into the 1980s. Diplomatic relations were officially re-established on 18 January 1992.

BUILDING A STRONGER FUTURE

From the 2000s onwards, bilateral cooperation deepened with state visits made by leaders of both countries. Prime Minister Hun Sen visited Singapore in 2000, touring key institutions and discussing opportunities for trade and investment. Prime Minister Goh Chok Tong visited Cambodia in 2001, followed by President S.R. Nathan in 2004. In 2005, Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong travelled to Cambodia to reaffirm ties and cooperation, while in 2006, Hun Manet emphasised enhancing collaboration, particularly in workforce development and trade during his visit to Singapore. In 2018, capacity-building efforts were strengthened with the upgrade of the Cambodia-Singapore Training Centre (CSTC) to the Cambodia-Singapore Cooperation Centre (CSCC).

RECENT DEVELOPMENTS: 2024–2025

The Cambodia–Singapore Forum 2024 ushered in a new chapter, promoting cooperation in finance, digitalisation, energy and logistics. With participation from hundreds of delegates and senior officials, the forum reaffirmed both nations' commitment to a strategic partnership.

In 2025, the Singapore embassy unveiled a commemorative logo marking 60 years of diplomatic ties. It features Angkor Wat and the Merlion in the colours of both nations' flags. A circle represents unity, with blue symbolising peace and red signifying vitality. The design reflects the shared aspirations of both countries in the areas of education, culture and the economy.

Voices of Cambodian Youths

Eung Ingter:

Cambodia-Singapore ties are stable and meaningful. Singapore's educational and economic models inspire Cambodia. As long as mutual respect and communication remain central, the partnership will endure.

Wu Fan:

Educational exchanges between the two countries have enhanced Cambodia's academic standards. Singaporean professionals teach in Cambodia, and Cambodian students study in Singapore. Joint research also addresses global challenges like climate change and healthcare, and this helps youths of both countries to become more globally-minded.

Piseth Chan Ousa:

With Singapore's support, Cambodia has the potential to expand its renewable energy exports like hydro and solar power.

Ly Vong Yanit:



Crestar Education Group Launch First K-12 School in Phnom Penh

TG International School (TGIS), owned by Singapore-based Crestar Education Group (CEG), officially launched its first K-12 campus at Tuol Kork in Phnom Penh on Saturday, along with its Kinderland International Preschool in the country. Established in 1977, CEG now has over 120 centres across eight Asia-Pacific countries and is poised for further expansion, targeting markets like Vietnam and Australia in the near future. The state-of-the-art campus in Toul Kork is equipped with facilities including a technology hub, science labs and an indoor sports gymnasium, and it can accommodate up to 700 students. Situated in the bustling heart of Phnom Penh, TGIS and Kinderland provides holistic education that emphasises academic excellence, character development and global citizenry.

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Education, Youth and Sport, Dr. Hang Chuon Naron, presided over the grand launch on 14 Dec 2024, attended by prominent figures, including Her Royal Highness, Princess Norodom Rattana Devi, Ms. Bernice Seow, Second Secretary (Political), Singapore Embassy, H.E. Chea Cheat, Secretary General of MOEYS, several educationists, and business leaders.

In his keynote address, Dr. Naron appreciates CEG for investing in Cambodia and the company's confidence in the country. The new school, he said, increases the opportunity for Cambodian children to access quality international education.

The Deputy Prime Minister highlighted the efforts of the Royal Government to make Cambodia a high-income developed country by 2050 and the role played by the education system to elevate the quality of the human capital. Dr. Naron said the Cambodian government has placed high importance on Science. Technology. Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) education. Schools in both public and private sectors are instrumental in these efforts and the government has always been at the vanguard in supporting quality education, he said.

"Now we have different systems of education in the country, including the Singapore system, and this gives parents and students several options to choose from," the Deputy Prime Minister said of the rising presence of international schools in the country, especially in Phnom Penh.


This mural celebrates 60 years of friendship between Cambodia and Singapore, painted by our students:

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



A SPOTLIGHT ON CAMBODIAN CULTURE AND HERITAGE

The Gardens collaborated with the Royal Embassy of Cambodia on two memorable occasions. In May 2024, the Cloud Forest featured Orchids of Angkor Wat, where around 50 orchid species native to Cambodia, as well as their hybrids, were showcased amid a 3.5m-tall recreation of the Angkor Wat. Over 1.1 million visitors enjoyed the beauty of these orchids during the display period.

In June 2025, to commemorate 60 years of diplomatic relations between Singapore and Cambodia, a two-day cultural showcase was held at the Flower Dome. It featured the vibrant traditions of Cambodian dance, including the Royal Ballet of Cambodia, a millenia-old dance form that is recognised as an Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity by UNESCO and ancient craftsmanship.

Outside of these two special occasions, visitors can also spot orchids native to Cambodia in the Gardens. The Supertree Grove is home to Cymbidium finlaysonianum while Dendrobium leonis and Dendrobium secundum can be found at the Malay Garden.



SuperPort™, beginning with our flagship development in Vietnam, are not standalone facilities. They are built to function as an integrated network, supported by digital infrastructure and multimodal transport systems that allow goods to move more efficiently across borders.

The Cambodia SuperPort™ will play a key role in this network, strengthening connectivity across the Mekong subregion and linking

it more closely with the rest of ASEAN. Beyond enhancing regional trade, the Cambodia SuperPort™ will advance the nation's logistics infrastructure, accelerate industrial development, and elevate Cambodia's position in the global value chain.

This approach aligns with global investment trends and Cambodia's own environmental goals.

Human talent development is just as critical as infrastructure. Through our EduRise programme, we will help build a skilled logistics workforce in Cambodia. This ensures that the SuperPort™ is not just technically advanced, but also locally grounded and future-ready. In every market that we operate in, we have seen that long-term success depends on people who can manage complexity, lead change and drive innovation.

Cambodia's FMCG Retail Evolution: Reflections and Forward View

As Singapore and Cambodia celebrate six decades of diplomatic relations this year, it is both an honour and a meaningful corporate milestone for me to reflect on this journey as a Singaporean expatriate in Cambodia. After beginning my career in Myanmar, I moved to Cambodia in 1996 and spent a year at Anco-Jel before starting my tenure with Goodhill Enterprise in 1997.

I have witnessed the remarkable transformation of Cambodia and the evolution of its Fast-Moving Consumer Goods (FMCG) industry over the past 29 years. Goodhill has also grown into one of the leading sales and distribution organisations in the country.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR FMCG BRANDS IN CAMBODIA

Cambodia presents a unique and expanding platform for FMCG brands seeking growth in Southeast Asia. As the market matures, several opportunities have emerged, particularly for brands that can adapt quickly to evolving consumer preferences and retail dynamics.

These opportunities include:

 The Rising Demand for Premium and Health-Oriented Products

With increasing disposable income and heightened awareness of health and wellness, particularly postpandemic, Cambodian consumers are showing greater



interest in premium offerings. There is a growing appetite for products that are perceived to be healthier, safer, and of higher quality, including fortified beverages, organic foods, skincare items with functional benefits and hygiene-related products.

 Untapped Cold-Chain Categories

The current cold-chain infrastructure in Cambodia remains underdeveloped, especially outside major cities. This presents a strategic opening for FMCG brands in dairy, frozen ready-to-eat meals, chilled beverages and fresh nutrition categories.

 Integrated Omnichannel Expansion

As traditional retail coexists with emerging digital platforms,

brands that can operate across both channels will find the greatest success. Physical store visibility remains essential. especially in rural and general trade settings, but urban consumers are increasingly turning to mobile commerce, chat-based ordering, and social platforms like TikTok and Facebook for product discovery and purchase. FMCG companies that craft integrated campaigns and fulfilment models to serve both retail shelves and digital carts can maximise reach and relevance.

Insight-Driven Retail Execution
As modern retail chains continue
to grow, data-driven category
management is becoming a
differentiator. Brands that can
offer retailers performance
insights -ranging from
shopper behaviour and shelf
productivity to promotional
effectiveness -are more likely

to secure preferred placements and collaborative marketing support. There is substantial opportunity for FMCG brands to become not just suppliers, but strategic category partners to retailers.

Positioning Through
Sustainability and Purpose
Cambodia's youthful
demographic is increasingly
influenced by brand values.
FMCG brands that integrate
sustainability — whether
through eco-friendly packaging,
ethical sourcing, or visible social
responsibility efforts — are

more likely to resonate with younger consumers. Positioning that reflects authenticity, transparency and contribution to community welfare will strengthen long-term brand equity in the local context.

NAVIGATING CHALLENGES: WHAT ENTRANTS SHOULD KNOW

Despite these promising trends, Cambodia remains a complex retail landscape. Route-to-market costs are often high. This is due to rural fragmentation and the fact that listing fees in modern retail channels can be substantial. Customs documentation,

especially for food, beverage and pharmaceutical products, can also present delays without the right local support.

Moreover, last-mile logistics can be patchy outside of Phnom Penh. While labour costs remain competitive, there is a clear shortage of skilled professionals in areas such as category management, trade marketing and digital engagement. To succeed, incoming brands are advised to:

 Partner with an experienced nationwide distributor who understands the nuances of

- traditional and modern retail channels.
- Plan for sustained trade marketing investment, including sampling, in-store promotion and shelf visibility initiatives.
- Engage in localised digital marketing by partnering with Khmer-speaking key opinion leaders and platforms.
- Ensure flexibility in logistics and inventory planning, particularly in peak seasons and during provincial deliveries.
- Invest in capability building, either directly or through your distribution partner, to bridge local skills gaps.

PARTNERING FOR CAMBODIA'S FMCG FUTURE

Cambodia is entering a new chapter in its consumer retail story that is defined by youth, connectivity and economic momentum. For brands that are agile, committed, and that have good partners, the opportunities are plentiful. Goodhill is proud to have been part of this journey and welcomes future collaborators to join us in building Cambodia's next-generation FMCG landscape.

Developing the Next Generation of STEM Leaders

SHARE WITH US YOUR AFFINITY WITH CAMBODIA

I was asked to chair the church missions committee of Aldersgate Methodist Church (AMC) in 2006. AMC supported the small village church of Prek Omperl, which was an open shed with a small back room for the local pastor to live in.

From 2006 to 2010, we had members of the church visit Prek Omperl and made improvements to the premises. The church also established a scholarship programme for youths who did well in the Cambodian grade 12 examinations. They were awarded scholarships to universities in Phnom Penh. We purchased two shophouses and turned them into a 50-bed student hostel dubbed "The Methodist Hostel" for our Prek Omperl students and others from the provinces.

The next step involved partnering some Cambodian Christian young adults in starting a literacy programme for the slum children who lived near the Monivong Bridge.

In 2013, all the programmes were running smoothly and I felt it was time for me to retire at the age of 70.





WHAT WERE SOME THAT YOU FELT YOU COULD SUPPORT?

Around that time, I was introduced to the then Minister of Education Hang Choun Naron, who is now the Deputy PM. He asked that I help start a STEM University like NTU. We decided on setting up a STEM secondary school instead to provide a solid foundation for those aspiring to enter university.

MOEYS assigned the use of an old, disused block of classrooms in Yukunthor High School for our use. With a donation from Mitsubishi Corporation, we renovated and equipped the block, and E2STEM took off from there.



WHAT WAS YOUR VISION FOR E2STEM IN CAMBODIA?

Our vision was to set up an excellent science school, where students have the capacity to become 21st century scholars who are strong in the sciences, mathematics and English. Incidentally, 'E2' stands for English and e-Learning, while STEM is the acronym for science, technology, engineering and mathematics.

Our MOU with the MOEYS was for a five-year pilot programme, with

a view to extending it by another five years so as to roll out the programme to five more public secondary schools.

WHAT ARE SOME MEMORABLE EXPERIENCES AT E2STEM?

Even at the end of their first year with us, many students said they had learnt much and had changed and were no longer the same students who had entered our doors.

Even after the closure of the school, E2STEM alumni came to us voluntarily to be new trainers-cummentors to recruit new students to participate and compete in the First Global Robotics Competition (FGRC) in 2024.

In Athens, our Cambodian team did extremely well. They won awards and were ranked among the top three global teams.

Our 'Girls in Technovation' programme also made headway in 2025. Two E2STEM teams were among the Cambodian National Pitch of 15 teams selected, and our younger team, consisting of girls from Years 9 and 10, made it to the Global Finals.



COULD YOU SHARE ONE CHALLENGING ISSUE THAT YOU FACED?

During the pilot phase, we found that the students' abilities and strengths in the sciences, mathematics and even English and Khmer varied widely. We even had students whose competencies were below the Year 7 level. Thankfully, we had a group of very dedicated young teachers who gave these students one-to-one coaching during their breaks to help them catch up.

WHAT IS YOUR VIEW OF THE ROLE AND FUTURE OF STEM EDUCATION IN CAMBODIA?

Cambodia needs well-trained and well-educated professionals for a world where AI and digital technology dominate, or the country risks being left behind. Good STEM teachers will nurture the next generation of engineers, scientists, digital professionals etc. This will, however, take decades and not just five years!

WHAT ARE YOUR HOPES FOR THE NEXT GENERATION OF LEADERS IN CAMBODIA?

I believe that E2STEM has provided students in Cambodia with a firm foundation in core subjects. My hope is that the best practices and success of E2STEM will be replicated in other Cambodian schools. It is through education that Cambodia will be able to have good leaders and teachers to further develop their people and nurture their latent talents. If the country prioritises the education and development of her people, only then can Cambodia grow and develop.

COO of Emperors of China and Dim Sum Emperors

If you have dined at Emperors of China and Dim Sum Emperors, then you should be introduced to Denise Lum. She is the Chief Operating Officer of Wong & Meas Restaurant Co., Ltd, as well as a board member of the Cambodian Restaurant Association and member of Chaîne des Rôtisseurs, an International Association of Gastronomy, in Cambodia.

Since planting her roots in Cambodia in 2011, Denise has not looked back. Aside from the occasional homesickness, chaotic traffic in Phnom Penh and medical care for more complex health issues, she has fully embraced life here. She enjoys its rich cultural heritage, friendly people, relatively low cost of living, more relaxed pace of life and of course, its plethora of food options.

Denise is a breast cancer survivor. Running a food business is both mentally and physically demanding, but it remains a deep passion for her. With an extensive support network consisting of her family and friends, bosses, colleagues and customers, she was motivated to keep on going. In 2024, after battling cancer for a decade, Denise finally triumphed over her condition and completed

her cancer medications and treatments.

EVOLUTION OF CAMBODIA'S CULINARY LANDSCAPE (2014-2024)

According to Denise, Cambodia's food scene has undergone a significant transformation. In the past decade, it has been spurred by tourism growth, urbanisation, rising disposable incomes and a renewed interest in Khmer cuisine. From a primarily street food and traditional dining culture, the sector has evolved to become a more diverse and vibrant culinary landscape that incorporates international influences, fine dining and innovative food businesses.

PERSONAL EXPERIENCE

For Denise, she has had her fair share of challenges running a food business. These include having to contend with intense market competition that demands distinctive dining experiences, careful cost management across operations, the challenge of recruiting and retaining qualified staff, as well as the need to stay abreast of new restaurant technologies. In spite of these difficulties, Dim Sum Emperors has flourished. It has been able to maintain the consistent quality of

its food through strong supplier partnerships and clear product specifications across all its branches

CURRENT GROWTH TRENDS FOR THE F&B SECTOR

As a leader in the food industry. Denise has her finger on the pulse of the latest culinary trends. These include sustainable and organic food movements where farmto-table restaurants emphasise locally sourced ingredients. There is also increasing demand for vegetarian/vegan options. The sector has moreover seen the rise of cloud kitchens and homebased food businesses, where small entrepreneurs use Facebook and Instagram to sell homemade meals, desserts and specialty items on delivery apps. Notably. government and private sector initiatives, such as the Cambodia Food Expo, promote local food businesses. The Ministry of Tourism also supports culinary tourism as part of the "Cambodia: Kingdom of Wonder" campaign.

WORDS OF ENCOURAGEMENT

For entrepreneurs who wish to gain a foothold in the industry, Denise advises focusing on delivery-friendly concepts, specialty coffee or premium Khmer dining in Phnom Penh. Those interested in Siem Reap may consider investing in unique culinary experiences, such as food tours and cooking classes, or setting up ecoconscious cafés. In seaside towns like Kep and Sihanoukville, the focus is on seafood. Other well-known artisanal products from other parts of Cambodia include Kampot pepper and coffee from Mondulkiri.

Aside from fierce market competition (particularly in Phnom Penh) and the hiring and retention of staff, there are also regulatory hurdles to navigate and supply chain limitations for premium ingredients. Denise suggests collaborating with local partners through joint ventures as one way of dealing with regulatory obstacles.







Cambodia's 32nd SEA Games – A Celebration of Regional Unity

In 2023, the Kingdom of Cambodia had the distinguished honour of hosting the 32nd Southeast Asian (SEA) Games. This marked its inaugural role as host of a major international sporting event since gaining independence in 1953. The Games were primarily held in Phnom Penh, with the Morodok Techo National Stadium serving as the central venue. This stateof-the-art facility, with a seating capacity of 60,000, was the site of the grand opening ceremony on 5 May and the closing ceremony on 17 May.

The 32nd SEA Games featured 37 sports and brought together over 11,000 athletes from 11 Southeast Asian nations, representing a historic milestone in Cambodia's sporting history and a testament to its growing presence on the regional stage.

As reported by the Khmer Times, Cambodia announced it would waive all accommodation, transportation and meal fees for participating ASEAN delegations. This generous gesture underscored the spirit of regional solidarity and unity, affirming Cambodia's commitment to celebrating friendship with its Southeast Asian counterparts through sports.

SINGAPORE'S PARTICIPATION AND HIGHLIGHTS

Singapore fielded a contingent of 558 athletes across 30 sports at the 32nd SEA Games. The national team delivered an impressive performance, securing a total of 158 medals which included 51 gold, 43 silver and 64 bronze. This earned the country a 6th-place finish in the overall standings.

According to CNA, Singapore's swimming team continued to dominate, contributing significantly to the medal tally. Notably, Quah Ting Wen and her teammates in the women's 4x100m freestyle relay clinched Singapore's historic 1.000th SEA Games gold medal. In athletics, Shanti Pereira achieved a sprint double victory, winning gold in both the 100m and 200m events. These remarkable achievements not only elevated Singapore's sporting reputation on the international stage but also saw several athletes setting new personal bests.

CAMBODIA-SINGAPORE TORCH RELAY

On 15 April 2023, the Royal Torch Relay Ceremony for the 32nd SEA Games was held at Tampines Central Park in Singapore ahead of the official Flag Presentation. Singaporean athletes were joined by His Excellency Mr. Hor Sarun, Secretary of State for the Ministry of Tourism and Special Envoy of the Cambodia SEA Games Organising

The Royal Torch Relay began in Cambodia on 20 March 2023 and iourneved through various ASEAN countries before returning home for the commencement of the Games. This symbolic relay served as a powerful representation of regional friendship, sportsmanship and the enduring diplomatic ties between Cambodia and Singapore, which have spanned six decades.

Cambodia offered me a rare opportunity to take risks, build from the ground up, learn from setbacks and keep moving forward. That kind of freedom is something I value immensely.





Building a Design Practice in Cambodia

Jovin Ong

I am Jovin Ong, founder of Labyrinth Associates. In Cambodia, I have had the rare chance to build a design studio from the ground up in a market very different from where I started in Singapore. What began as a 3D rendering company during the COVID-19 lockdown evolved into a multidisciplinary practice that blends architecture, interiors, branding and storytelling.

HOW CAMBODIA'S CREATIVE GAPS INSPIRED A PURPOSE-DRIVEN PRACTICE

Singapore's design industry is highly structured and saturated, full of polished systems and repeated trends. When I came to Cambodia to revisit work that I had done with my father on the Shangri-La hotel in Phnom Penh, what struck me was the absence of basic systems, reliable trades and access to materials. These were the things I had taken for granted back home in Singapore. Yet, that gap created space to build. It forced adaptability, encouraged problem-solving, and opened the doors to setting new standards rather than following existing ones.

Business here is driven by trust and relationships rather than SOPs. That makes growth less predictable but more personal, and that was precisely what made me decide to stay. Labyrinth Associates was born out of that challenge: to build thoughtfully, design meaningfully and deliver with purpose in a market that is still defining itself.

SPACE TO GROW

Unlike in Singapore, where many design briefs mirror each other, every project here brings something different, and that freedom pushes us to constantly evolve.

Younger designers are benefitting from this as well. Exposure to a wide variety of projects, ranging from hospitality to retail to mixed-use developments, makes them hungry, bolder and more experimental.

Nevertheless, gaps remain. Material availability is still limited and workmanship can be inconsistent. But things are improving as the ecosystem matures. Contractors

better materials are slowly entering the market.

GROWING A TEAM

What I have discovered is that Cambodian employees are willing to learn. They need opportunities and trust. They may hesitate at first, but if you give them the space to ask, fail, and try again, they will rise to the challenge.

At Labyrinth, I focus heavily on internal growth. I teach what I know — from material application to 3D workflows — and bring the team to visit good project sites, not just to complete the work but to understand the process. I also hope to impart lessons that I have learnt to help other businesses wanting to come into the Cambodian

market. to make fewer missteps.

DEVELOPING LABYRINTH INTO A HOUSEHOLD NAME

My long-term goal is simple: I want Labyrinth Associates to be a name that design students in Cambodia aspire to join. Just like how I once dreamt of interning at KR+D in Singapore, I hope young creatives here see Labyrinth as a place to grow, build and be proud of their work.

Beyond that, I dream of designing a landmark that is iconic, instantly recognisable and proudly Cambodian. It will be a space that is not only aesthetically stunning, but also emblematic of national identity and pride.

For now, this is where I want to be.

Carving Out a Niche by Setting Up a Sleep Clinic

Michelle Teo

Michelle Teo, the founder of The SnooZze Clinic by Zzenith in Singapore and The SnooZze Clinic in Cambodia, is a board-registered polysomnographic technologist who is also board-certified in Clinical Sleep Health. She manages patients with Obstructive Sleep Apnoea from as early as the pre-testing stage to diagnostic tests and Continuous Positive Airway Pressure (CPAP) therapy management.

MICHELLE'S STARTING POINT

In 2019, a Cambodian patient was referred to me by an ENT specialist for CPAP therapy management in Singapore. In 2020, this patient needed a top-up of CPAP supplies, and there were no trusted suppliers in Cambodia. I had planned to send the items to him by air freight, but it was so exorbitant that I decided to fly in to deliver the items personally. I had intentions of exploring a business, but there wasn't interest and I returned to Singapore disheartened.

A BREAKTHROUGH AND CHALLENGES

In October 2023, I made another trip to Phnom Penh and met up with a medical director I had been introduced to previously. This time, it was different. Her

team comprised doctors and nurses of various nationalities who were somewhat more exposed to Obstructive Sleep Apnoea and CPAP therapy.

It has now been almost two years since I set up my business, but this journey has not been without speed bumps. The vague rules and regulations which I could not make sense of, hiring challenges and understanding cultural nuances were all issues I had to slowly navigate and grapple with.


HELP FROM "BENEFACTORS"

One thing I had to get used to in Cambodia was asking for help when necessary. I realised I could not handle all the business-related operational and administrative tasks on my own. Without the help I had received from an endless stream of "benefactors", there would not have been any progress from October 2023.

Company registration would have taken months if I had not received help from a young man who also drove me around to sign up for phone lines, open personal and business bank accounts, and even to a photo studio to have my official photos taken. A Cambodian patient got his subordinate to assist in locating the village chief to

validate some documents before the commune chief would do so. These documents were part of my submission to obtain a company license from the Ministry of health.

When I had to return to Singapore before the documents for submission could be completed. my landlady took time off work over three days to get them signed at the various government agencies, and she did it without my knowledge. The most unforgettable incident was when an airport staff member whom I had befriended on previous trips and her supervisor re-opened the check-in counter for me to board my flight when I arrived 10 minutes after the check-in counters had closed. This would never have been possible in Singapore.





REASONS FOR SETTING UP SHOP IN PHNOM PENH

A very common question posed to me is "Why Phnom Penh?" or "Why Cambodia?" Many have attempted to get me to explore other comparatively richer countries, but to no avail. I am no Mother Theresa, so it would be a lie to say I had no intentions of making any money. However, what was as important to me as making money was my desire to create an awareness of Obstructive Sleep Apnoea, and the resultant complications if the condition remained unaddressed. I wanted to share my knowledge and enable those already on CPAP therapy to have access to proper therapy management for better patient outcomes.

I currently shuttle between Singapore and Phnom Penh, with three weeks spent in Singapore and one in Phnom Penh. It is not a hassle as it helps preserve my sanity by allowing me some "me time" every month. I use my time more efficiently by packing my days with more patient appointments instead of spreading them out over the whole month. Who knows? I might just eventually move to Phnom Penh when my patients in Singapore no longer need me.




ChargePlus Cambodia's Big Dreams

This expansion, set for completion around 2030-2031, will further elevate Singapore's attractiveness as a hub for large-scale meetings, conferences and entertainment. For Cambodian fans who have previously travelled to Singapore to watch global superstars such as Taylor Swift, Bruno Mars and Blackpink, this new development will significantly enhance those experiences. This includes two new luxury hotels, waterfront promenades, highend F&B zones and a unique "mountain trail" attraction, all designed with an emphasis on sustainability. With this focus on eco-friendly construction and smart energy use, the RWS development reflects Singapore's shift toward futureready tourism. This waterfront development, opening toward the end of the decade, will offer Cambodian families an enhanced travel experience.

For Cambodian international students holding a long-term visit pass, entering Singapore has never been easier. All that is required is iust a facial scan and a filledin e-arrival card. Singapore's excellent flight connections and ease of entry make it a perfect stopover or short-term destination for students looking for a safe, modern and enriching experience while abroad.


